We partner with communities to make sure that people have access to safe, affordable housing, fresh food, clean air, primary care and economic opportunities. Improving these conditions promotes health equity among people in low-income neighborhoods and improves the health of entire communities.

We invest through these focus areas:

Integration of Health and Human Services

In partnership with the Human Services Program, we create more seamless, effective and sustainable systems that advance social and economic mobility and improve the health and well-being of people and communities in cities across the country.

Institutional Investments in Community Health

We aim to influence the investment policies and practices of institutions to create equitable and sustainable economies that contribute to healthy communities. We also build the capacity of community-based organizations to absorb and deploy investments.

Community-Driven Solutions

We partner with communities to drive locally determined solutions and policies that influence systems, services and practices and create equitable conditions that improve well-being.

Through grants to advance

on the Climate Change, Health & Equity initiative which includes:

- Supporting community-based nonprofit organizations and their capacity to implement policies and practices that advance climate resilience and reduce health risks equitably;
- Building the capacity of health systems and local health departments as leaders in promoting climate resilience and advocating for beneficial climate policies; and
- Shifting the practice of health practitioners so they engage in climate advocacy, influence public policy and consider climate change in their practice.

local public health officers with knowledge and skills to transform the role of public health in their community. The teams of leaders selected for the program receive leadership development, coaching and resources to advance new models of public health services and crosssector partnerships for their community.

The Kresge Health and Arts & Culture Programs

collaborated to fund neighborhood-scale projects demonstrating creative, cross-sector visions of foodoriented development through the FreshLo initiative. FreshLo projects intentionally integrate healthy food, creative placemaking, community development and equity in their work.
